Coaches Award Hannah Williams

My aim as a senior coach for the past 3 seasons has been to give our younger players more opportunities and become a more competitive side. I wanted to create a belief that our team could match it with any side in the league. Our margins proved that we had that belief — only 2 teams defeated us by more than 10 goals — and those 2 teams finished at the top of the ladder. We made a comment that it was disappointing to be getting so close, but getting no reward. But realistically, we have been rewarded. We've been rewarded by ticking off our own goals.

In 2022 we won 2 games. In 2023, we won 7 games. We finished that season with 4 straight wins, so the pressure was on for this season to continue our winning streak. We did - we won 6 in row and got a cover photo on the footy record.

Our streak came to an end though with a 1 goal loss against Otway. We managed 6 wins this season and finished 7th on the ladder.

For those that aren't aware of how much youth is in this team – at the start of the season we had 6 players between the ages of 15 – 17. The raw talent these kids have has been so amazing to watch and help to develop these junior players into a senior players.
